

Glen is preceded in death by, his parents; first wife of fifty-two years, Amber Koelemay; son, Keith Koelemay; stepson, Wesley Hebert.








GIANT STACKS

Giant haystacks are going up for the fourth year along FM 1406 north of Winnie on the Koelemay Ranch. Glen Koelemay, pictured, says it's "just another way" to make hay. Stacks are 15 feet wide, 20 feet long, and about 15 feet high. Each holds the equivalent of 250 bales of hay. About 60 stacks are planned to last the Kolemay's cattle until Feb. 1. Then conventional bales will finish the feeding season. Stacking is considered a way to save farm labor.
































