Doris Jean Roebuck, 85, of Nederland, Texas, went home to be with the Lord on July 7, 2023. She was born in Zavalla, Texas, on May 31, 1938, to Donald and Mollie (Lock) Brown. Because her mother died just eight days after her birth, Doris was raised by Mollie's brother, Bill Locke, and his wife, Jesse, her "Momma and Daddy," who did not have any children of their own. They

loved her more than anything and "spoiled her rotten," as she would admit. Just prior to graduating from Zavalla High School in 1956, she married the love of her life, Frank Roebuck, her husband for the next 67 years. She and Frank lived in Port Arthur, Texas, and Groves, Texas, before settling in Beauxart Gardens, near Nederland, where they remained for the next 58 years.

In 1970, Doris began her career as a tax preparer for H&R Block, during which she made lifelong friendships, not only with her coworkers, but also her clients, several of whom returned to her every year for decades. Those who knew her will not be surprised to know she knew much more about her clients than just their taxes. She used their brief annual appointments to catch up on their families, their health, their joys, and their losses. She hated to leave her clients in 2013, but she retired to take care of Frank after he suffered a stroke.

She worked long days during tax season, but during the rest of the year, she and Frank regularly traveled in their RV to bluegrass festivals around Texas. They spent many weekends at Triple Creek, outside Woodville, Texas, listening to and often singing bluegrass and gospel music. They also loved the annual bluegrass festivals at Salmon Lake in Grapeland, Texas. They both loved bluegrass music, and one of their favorite songs to sing was "Rose of My Heart," a love song each would be singing to the other.

Doris publicly professed her faith in Jesus Christ, and throughout their years in Southeast Texas, Doris and Frank were faithful members of Central Baptist Church in Port Arthur, First Baptist Church of Beauxart Gardens, and First Baptist Church of Nederland.

Doris's family sends its heartfelt gratitude to the caregivers of Montebello Home Care and Bonne Vie for the love and care they showed to Doris.

Doris is survived by her husband, Frank; two children: Lisa Travis and her husband, Rick, of Frisco, Texas, and Kyle Roebuck and his love of five years, Donna Anders, of Nederland; four grandchildren: Shannon Field and her husband, David, of Fort Worth, Texas; Abby Travis and her fiancé, Tim Hoang, of Richardson, Texas; Sam Travis of Frisco; and Kiley Roebuck of Nederland; three great-grandchildren: Aiden Field, Christian Field, and Isla Field; two sisters: Cheryl Tittle and Lynne Knippers; and numerous beloved nephews, nieces, and in-laws.

She was preceded in death by her mother and father; her "Momma and Daddy"; her sisters, Billie Nerren, Earlene Mayfield, Nelda Martin, Donna Harris, and Elaine Stovall; her brother, Earnest Ray Mott; her nephew, Steven Mayfield; and her nieces, Diane Butler, and Juanita Mott.

Her earthly body will rest near her Momma and Daddy in Boykin Cemetery, near Zavalla.























