

He was born on October 25, 1942, in Wisconsin. to the late Russell T. and Marion (Buckley) Sutton, Grant loved Jesus, his family, friends, and church. He proudly served in the United States Army Reserve (1962-1964) and Air National the Texas Guard (1964-1968).

Grant suffered from Chronic Inflammatory Demyelinating Polyneuropathy (CIDP), but he never let it define him. His condition had progressed to a point that he needed assistance. He moved into Collier Park in May 2022 in Assisted Living. The staff at Collier Park were welcoming and caring and Dad enjoyed visiting with them and sharing his smile, humor, and wisdom. In his last month, Altus Hospice was a blessing to him, and we are grateful for their high level of quality care.

Grant gave us permission to share that he was a proud member of the Alcoholics Anonymous community and had been sober since 1980. His serenity practice included the Twelve Steps and his daily reading of God's Word. His love for Jesus defined how he interacted with others. Grant encouraged those around him to be positive, grateful, and to love your neighbor. His favorite place outside of Beaumont was the deer lease in south Texas

where he spent time with his friends. Prior to 2010, you would find him on the golf course with his buddies several times a week. He graduated from French High School 1961. His work ethic was impeccable. He retired from inside sales in the comprehensive industrial hose products and services industry where he worked at American Hose Specialty and Industrial Power & Rubber. He loved his family and supported his granddaughters in sports, at the theater, and in band. He was a wonderful husband and the best father. After his wife went to heaven, he filled the shoes of Mom and Dad and listened to his daughters, loving them, and supporting them in every way. He was a wonderful friend to many and encouraged people to be grateful and look on the bright side. He was a prayer warrior with a long list of requests that he prayed over daily and would check to see how God answered. Grant will be missed in many ways including: His belief in the power of prayer and dedication, words of wisdom and affirmation, encouragement, and gentle authenticity.

He is survived by his daughter, Kim Browne and her husband, Trey, of Lumberton; granddaughters, Paige and Anna Kate Browne; daughter, Kari Anne Sutton of Sugar Land; and niece, Michelle Hall and her husband, David, of Minooka, Illinois.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Michele Lee "Mickey" Sutton, and his sister, Louise Gail Case.


