Lynette Carol Busceme (Cochran), 68, of Beaumont died August 17, 2023, following a brief illness. Lynette was born on March 18, 1955, to Earl Ray and JoBeth Cochran in La Porte, Texas. She was a devoted wife and loving mother.

After graduating from Lamar University in 1977 with a degree in Chemistry, Lynette chose to pursue a career in biomedical research at Helena Laboratories where she worked as Supervisor of Coagulation Research. While at Helena, Lynette helped develop testing processes to quantify blood clotting enzymes. In 1978, she began a forty-four-year marriage to Jim Busceme. Their first child, Adam, was born in 1981 but died in infancy. The loss of her beloved son led Lynette to embark on a career change toward education and the pursuit of a Master's of Education degree.

Lynette's educational career began as a middle school science teacher in Devers, Texas. Over the course of a long career in public education,

Lynette taught thousands of students in all secondary grades before moving into educational administration at Humble ISD. She received her Doctorate of Education from University of Houston and retired as Director of Academics after twenty-three years of public service. Her public school retirement marked the beginning of her time at Harding University, where she taught postgraduate courses and held the title of Director of Educational Leadership in the Harding College of Education. She shepherded numerous students through the dissertation process and remained friends with many long after their degrees had been conferred. Her time at Harding was among the most rewarding of her professional life and she was excited for the new semester that was about to begin.

A devout and lifelong Christian, Lynette taught Sunday school, Bible classes, and Bible studies at the various Churches of Christ she attended for more than forty years. She taught people from around the globe through World Bible School and was active in prison ministry. Lynette approached the study of the Bible with tenacity and was a lifelong student of Christ. Only days before her death, she traveled to view early Christian sites including Corinth and Ephesus.

An avid eBay seller for nearly twenty-seven years, Lynette spent most weekends visiting garage and estate sales to locate “treasures.” She took great pleasure in connecting people with significant mementos from their personal or family history and often shared the messages of appreciation she received from her customers. With thousands of sales under her belt, Lynette enjoyed sharing her knowledge with fledgling eBay sellers online as Dr. B Treasure Finder and had recently been featured on a podcast. Lynette prided herself on donating 100% of her profits to support various charitable efforts.

Survivors include her son, Matthew Busceme and daughter-in-law, Lauren; brother, Earl Cochran and wife, Tami; five nephews and two nieces; numerous great-nieces and -nephews; and countless friends. She is preceded in death by her husband, Jim; father and mother, Earl Ray and JoBeth Cochran; and son, Adam.
