Lenward Waylon "Red" Cooper, Sr., 82, of Silsbee, died Sunday, December 3, 2023. He was born on April 5, 1941, in Clay, Louisiana, to Woodrow Wilson and Hazel Crowell Cooper. He was the third of three sons, Huel Cooper, Douglas Cooper and Red.

He was raised in Chatham, Louisiana, where he excelled in baseball and basketball. He would spend a lot of time with the local law enforcement officer, Merf Tolar. After graduation from Chatham High School, he joined the United States Army.

After his honorable discharge, he married Patricia Jewel Jacobs. To that union were born four children, Lenward, Jr. "Nubbin," Steve, Gaylynn, and Jason. Red and his family were longtime residents of Silsbee, where all four of his children graduated.

Mr. Cooper is a United States Army veteran and retired from Southwestern Bell Telephone Company after twenty-seven years of service in February 1993, before going to work for Hardin County. Red served the citizens of Hardin County with honor and great pride for twenty-six years, one month, and sixteen days, serving as Bailiff for the 356th Judicial District Court under The Honorable Britt Plunk and The Honorable Steven Thomas from December 15, 1992, until January 31, 2019. He concurrently served as the elected Constable for JP Precinct 1 from January 1, 1993, until December 31, 2016.

Red was a longtime member of the First Pentecostal Church of Silsbee, where he served many years as church secretary and led the services for over forty years.
