


























# Cpl. C. Meaux Is Wounded In Vietnam 1967

Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Meaux of 5485 Maitland left Friday afternoon for Corpus Christi Naval Station Hospital to greet their son, Lance Cpl. Charles E. Meaux, who has been sent home wounded from Vietnam.

Cpl. Meaux, who will be 20 next Monday, was injured Monday near Quang Nam. A rifle bullet went through his left elbow and creased his side during enemy action.

He was treated in the station hospital at Da Nang before being sent to the states.

The corporal was the recipient of a Purple Heart for a previous wound sustained at Hill 54 in November of 1966.

He attended Forest Park High School before enlisting in the Marine Corps in April, 1965. He trained at Camp Pendleton, Calif., and has been in Vietnam since October of that year.
