

Bobby, AKA Uncle Bob, was a kind, selfless, and loving man who served as the backbone of our family for over four decades. His presence and love will truly be missed by so many, including his furry companion, Panda.

Bobby is survived by his loving wife, Clo Jane Little; brothers, Marvin Little, Jr. and his wife, Joann, and Nelson Little and his wife, Kim; daughters, Janette Sattler and Lanette Daigle and her husband, Cully. He leaves behind many nieces, nephews, grandchildren, and great grandchildren who loved him dearly.

He is preceded in death by his parents and nephew, Jackie Little.



When three grandsons, one granddaughter, and seven greatgrandchildren were added to the family, he never missed a beat, loving and spoiling each one of them like any other grandfather. A true testament to his character was when he was asked what he wanted to be called when the grandchildren were born. He settled on "Uncle Bob" because he felt that would be more respectful to their biological grandfather. At times, Uncle Bob was a father figure to the three grandsons and his instruction, patience and understanding was a tremendous influence in all our lives. We would not be who we are today without his loving imprint on each of us.

In June of 2023, at the age of 71, Uncle Bob was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia and had to spend several months as an in-patient at MD Anderson. The hardest part for Uncle Bob was not the treatments, but having to be apart from his family— most notably his grandchildren whom he loves dearly. Unfortunately, the type of cancer he has is not curable and we are afraid we may be running out of time with him. Before Uncle Bob became ill this past year, he was a self-taught, frugal, do-it-yourselfer who would read books and manuals before he would even consider hiring something done. No project was too big or small—he even built the home in which he and Clo Jane reside on Taylor's Bayou in Fannett, Texas.

Over the last year, we noticed Uncle Bob seemed to be running out of steam and was having a hard time completing projects around the house. One such project was re-modeling the upper deck to their home on stilts (much like a beach cabin). Currently there are no railings on their wrap-around porch, which is a cause for concern for his safety and the safety of the grandchildren when they come to visit. We are hoping to win this contest to help him out with one of the many incomplete projects around the house and show him our love, gratitude and how truly grateful we are to have such a wonderful, loving and selfless man in our lives.





















