Barbara is preceded in death by her husband, Joseph Richard Sr., and mother, Peggy Latiolais Evans.



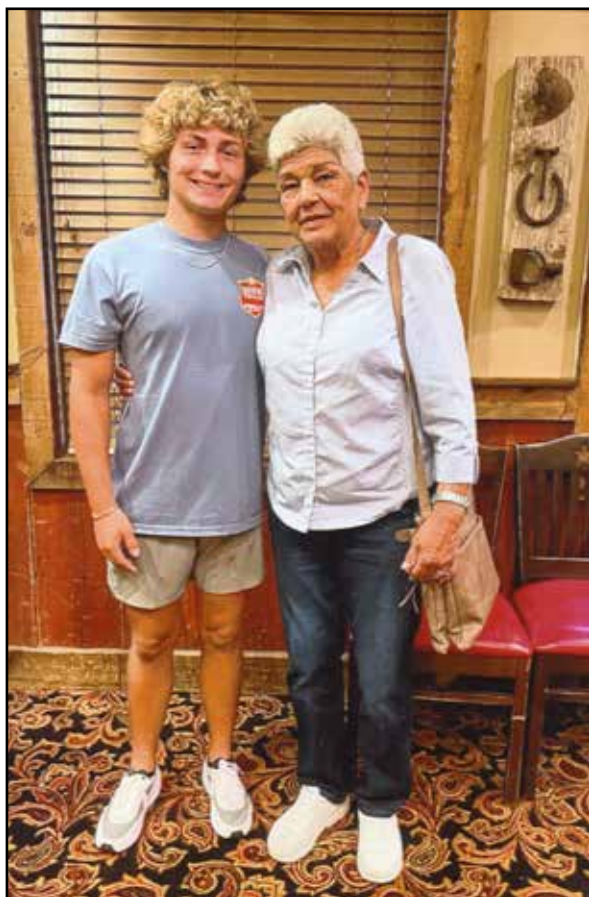
