Casinos were also a hobby of hers, including winning multiple jackpots!

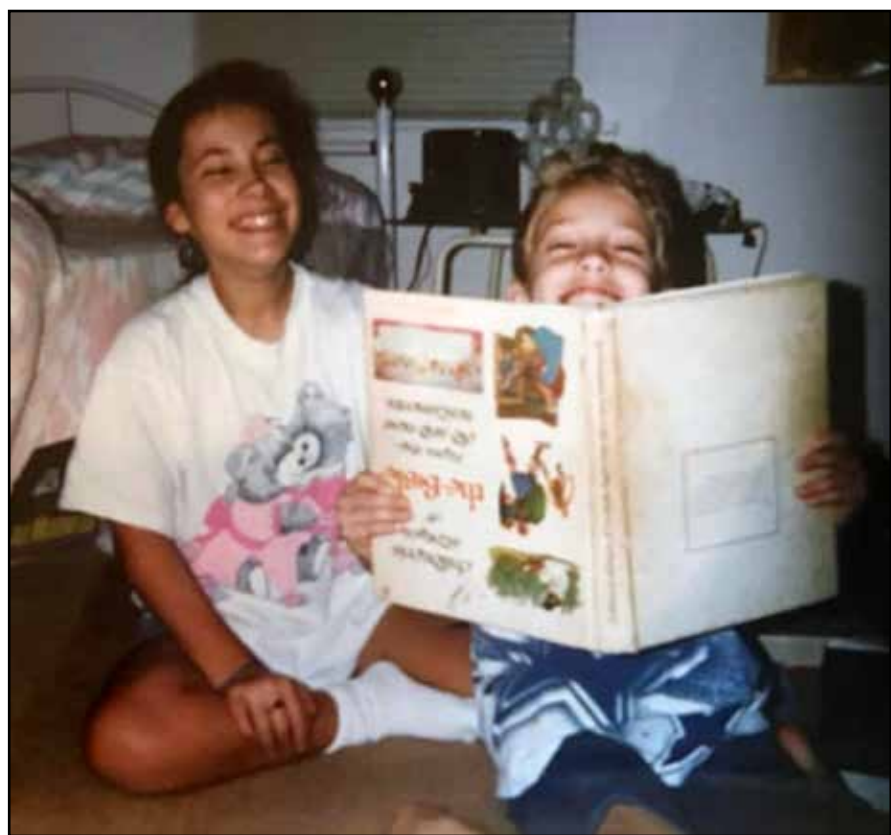
Her smile could light up a room, and her love for life and tenacity was inspiring to all who knew her.
