Joan Elizabeth Madigan, 94, of Beaumont, Texas, passed away peacefully, Sunday, May 19, 2024. She was born on June 19, 1929, to May Elizabeth Norton Stevenson and Merile Stevenson, in West Virginia.

Joan comes from a proud military family and moved throughout the country during her early life. After attending San Diego State College, Joan worked as an Airline Hostess for Braniff International Airways from 1950-1956. She loved the life-long friendships she made and the many travels she experienced with Braniff. Later in life, Joan became an active member of the "Clipped B's," an organization formed by former Braniff flight attendants. Joan attended yearly national Clipped B's conventions and took numerous international trips with her beloved friends from the alumni group.
