Michael Thomas "Mike" Murphy, 57, of Beaumont, died Wednesday, May 22, 2024, at Baptist Hospital of Southeast Texas, Beaumont. He was born on December 6, 1966, to Diane Borgen Murphy and Lawrence George Murphy, in Phoenix, Arizona.

His love for art only grew as he won many awards for photography, later was commissioned for pieces for the Women's Art League, and designed an album cover.

He loved teaching art to all ages through his years of teaching art. Michael loved explaining the historical and modern interpretations of art to his students and inspired many individuals. He saw art in everything around him which made his love for art so much more apparent.

Michael admired Keith Carter, a local well known photographer and educator. Anyone who was around him knew how much he loved the Chicago Cubs. He also shared a love for rock music artists, such as The Ramones, The Rolling Stones, The Dropkick Murphys, and a lot more. 













