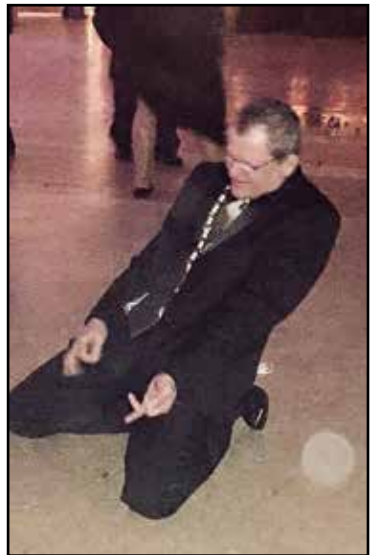

Allen will be dearly missed by his family, friends, and all who knew him.





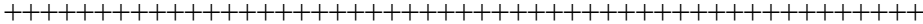




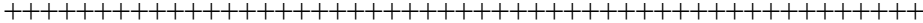
