We would like to thank Altus Hospice for the wonderful care and support they gave her and the family.













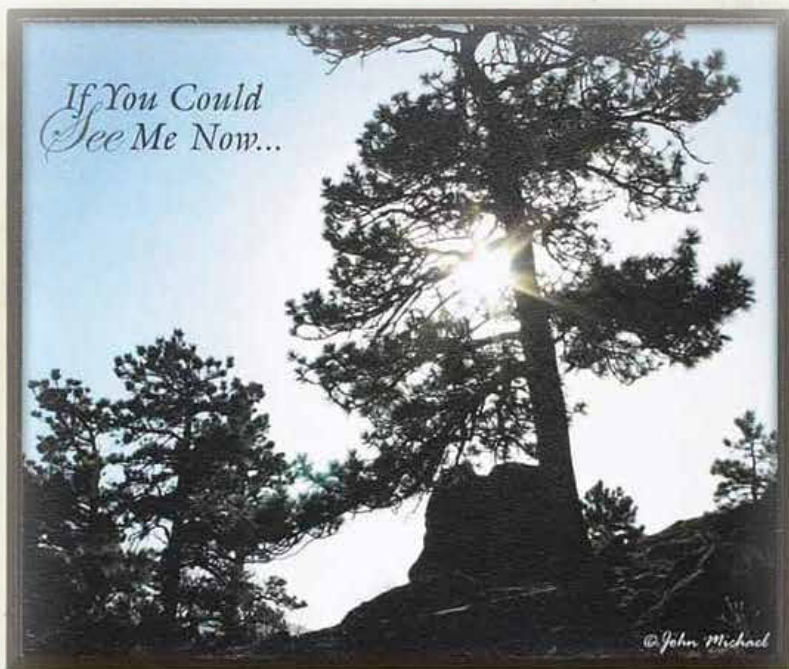












*If you could see me now, you wouldn't shed a tear.
