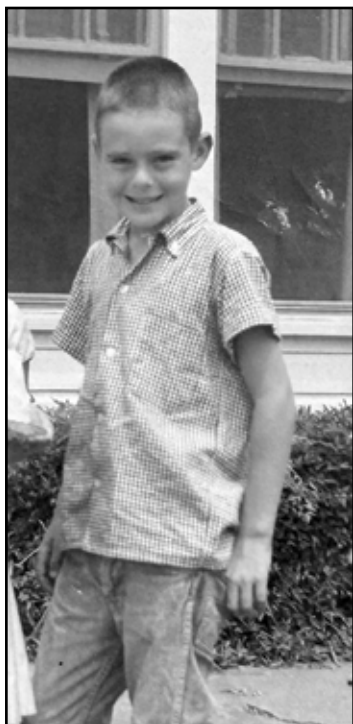
Norman was a devout Christian finding strength and solace in his faith. He found joy in time spent with his family on many trips to the beach.

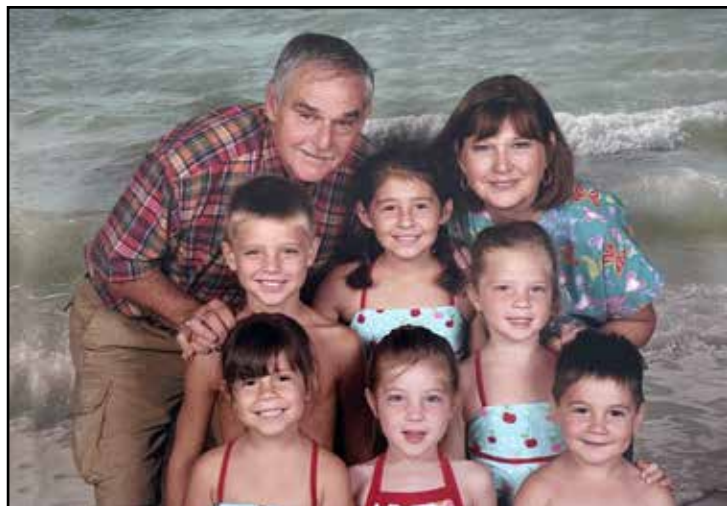
