Patricia Beatrice Culver, 92, of Sour Lake, died Tuesday, June 25th, 2024. She was born on June 6th, 1932, to Margaret Hilda Mott and Percy Arthur Gunner in Walton-on-Thames. Surrey, England. She was a professional dancer with Julie Andrews before coming to America in 1951 to marry her one and only husband, when she was 19 years old, and he was 21. Together they created a huge family. They were married for 71 years, and 9 months, until the Lord called
