He was preceded in death by his parents; wife, Cora Clubb Taylor; and daughter, Teresa Gayle Taylor.

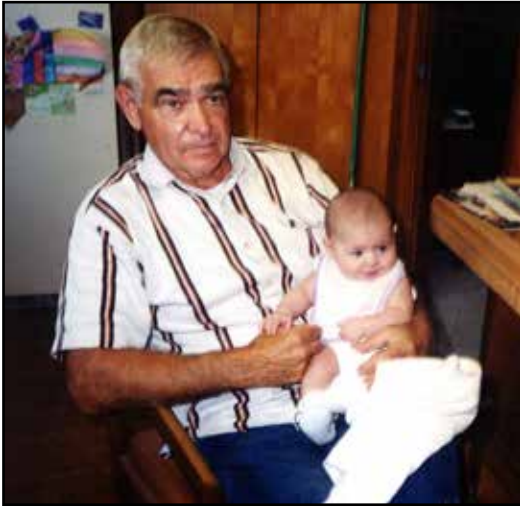


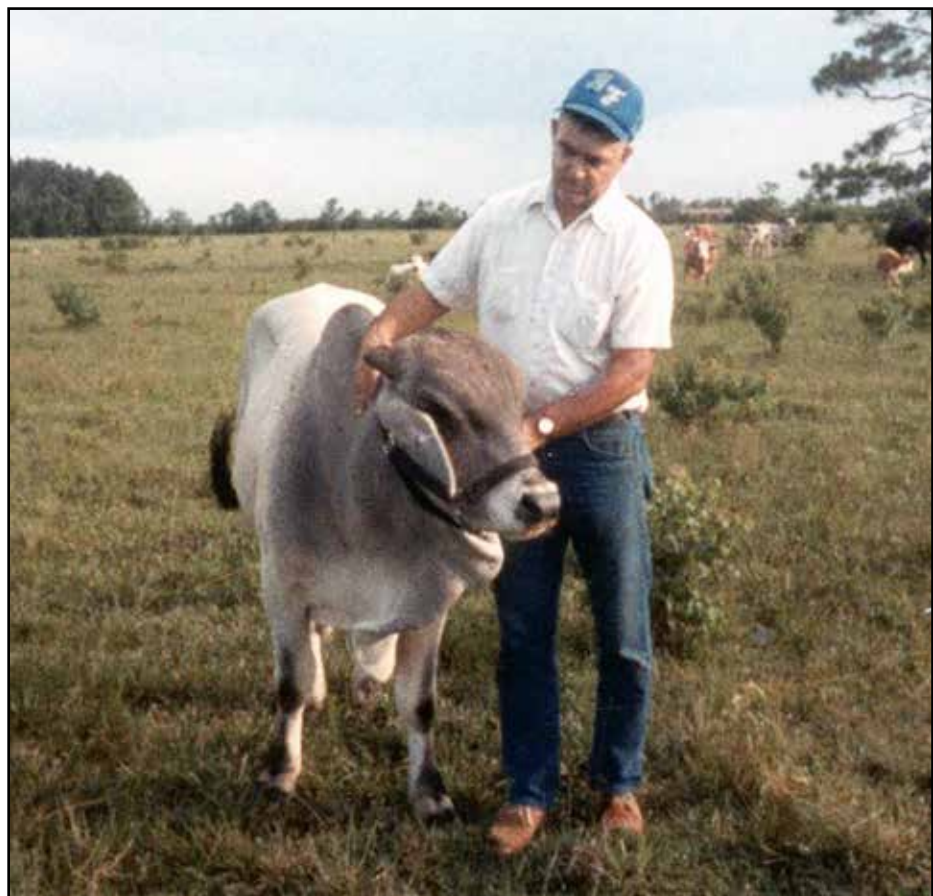


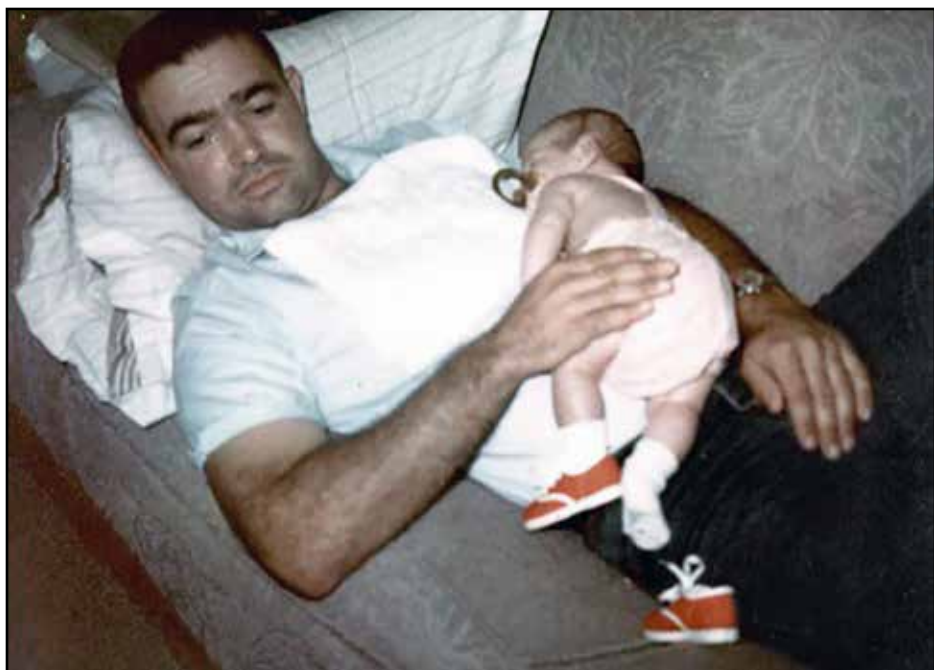
