Doris Juanita Frazier “Johnnie” of Beaumont, Texas, peacefully completed her earthly journey on September 10, 2024. Born on August 29, 1931, to Willie Phillips and George Mayo, Doris recently celebrated her 93rd birthday surrounded by family. Raised in DeQuincy, Louisiana, she later moved to the Rio Grande Valley before settling in Beaumont, where she attended Hotel Dieu School of Nursing.

After graduation, she embarked on a lifelong career in nursing and married the love of her life, Robert Edward Frazier, Jr., in December 1953. She began her professional journey in Labor & Delivery at St. Therese Hospital, continuing at St. Elizabeth Hospital in 1962. She assisted in bringing many babies into this world.
