And saw your tired face.

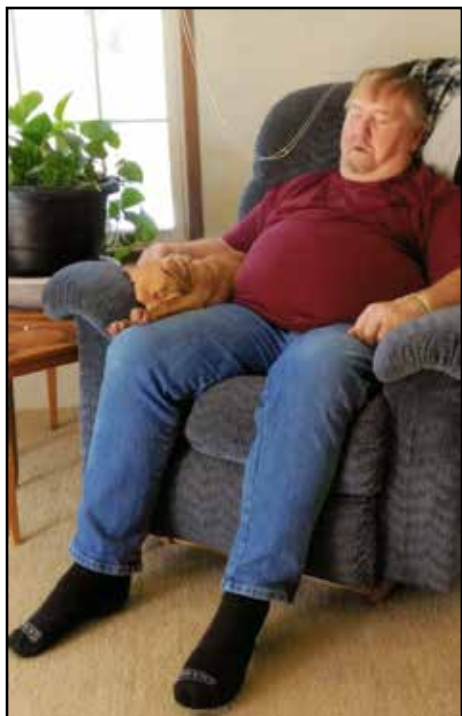
He put His arms around you,
