He was preceded in death by his parents, Sam and Dorothy Amaimo.



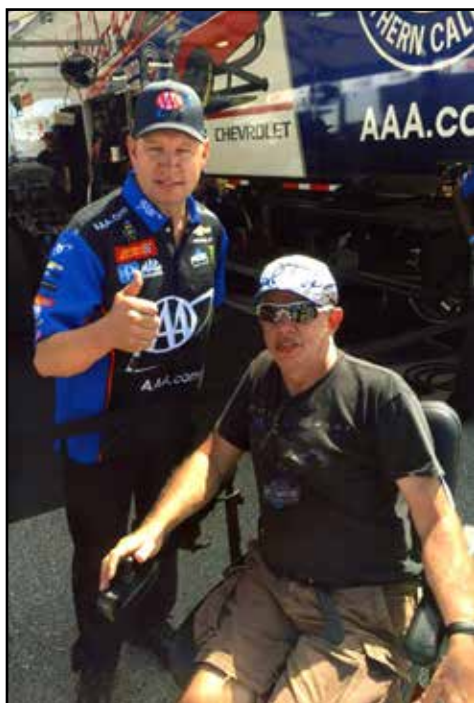
