Terry was a beloved father, husband, brother, friend, and proud veteran. Terry lived a life defined by service, creativity, and unconditional love for those around him.

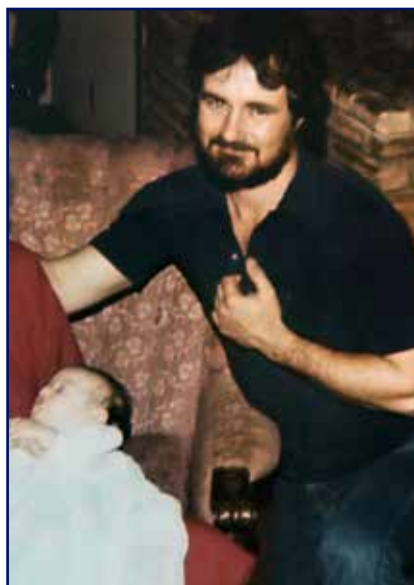
