Maggie is preceded in death by her grandparents; Dr. Jack Hopper, and Pat and U.E. DuPlant.

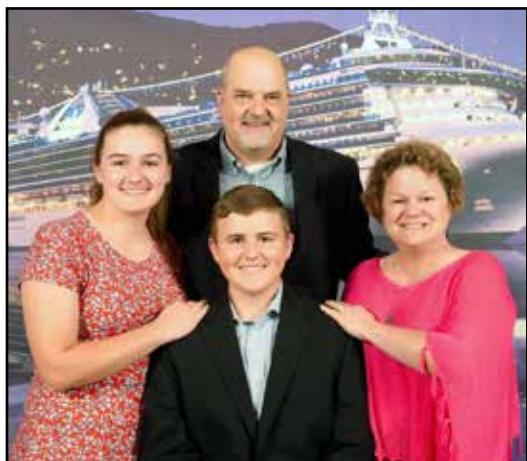
She is survived by her parents, Brad and Moni Hopper, and her brother, Holden Hopper.
