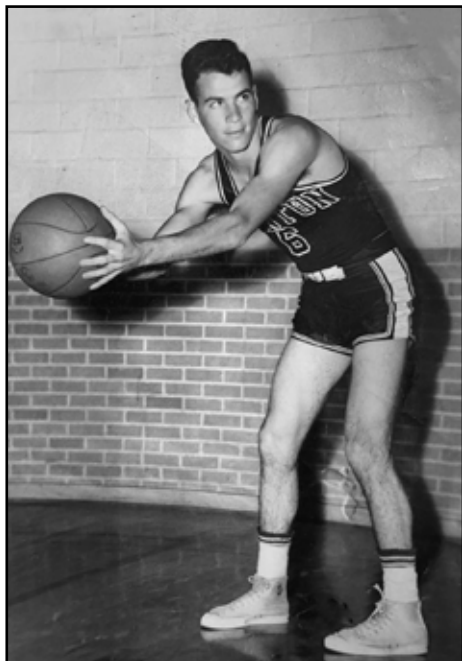
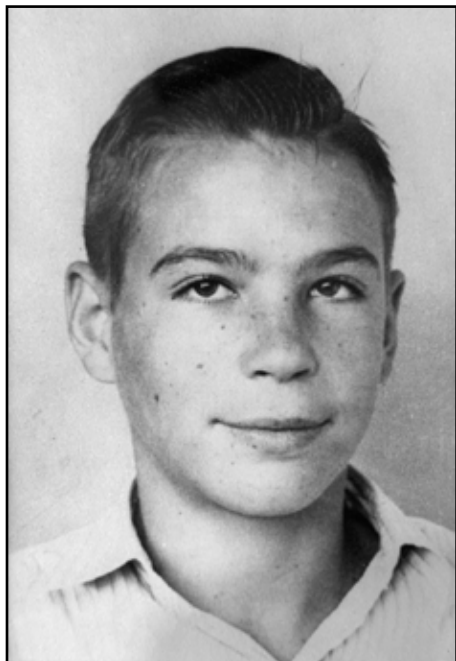

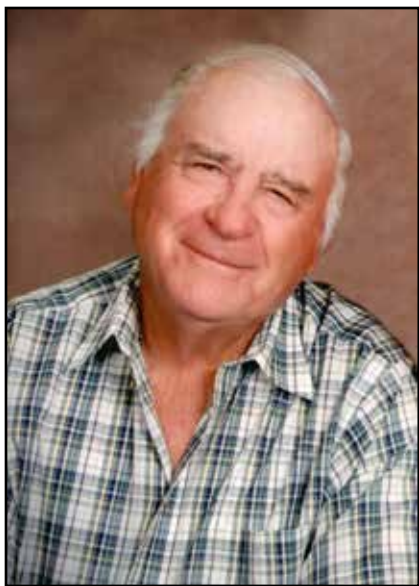

Spencer Davis Armour, Jr., 91, of Silsbee, passed away peacefully surrounded by family on Tuesday, April 15, 2025. He was born April 25, 1933, in Sabine Parish, Louisiana, to Mary Goss Armour and Spencer Davis Armour, Sr.

He was the oldest of three boys and grew up with a deep love for the outdoors and a strong work ethic that carried him throughout his life.

A self-made businessman, Spencer founded and operated Armour J. Auto Salvage for 50 years. It all started when he bought a wrecked 1953 Oldsmobile from its owner for \$16.50 in 1960. From there, he went on to invest every nickel and minute in a risky business venture that became one of the largest auto salvage yards this side of Waco.

Spencer took great pride in his work and building a life rooted in dedication, community, and integrity. He loved being a resident of Silsbee and sharing his success through his generosity with those in the community. He served on the Silsbee City Council in the 1970s and was a board member at First National Bank of Silsbee. He was also a longtime member of First Baptist Church Silsbee.

Spencer had a deep appreciation for nature. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, and spending time outdoors—especially if it involved operating machinery. Whether he was bush hogging a field or bulldozing a path through the woods, he was happiest under an open sky. In his younger years, he could often be

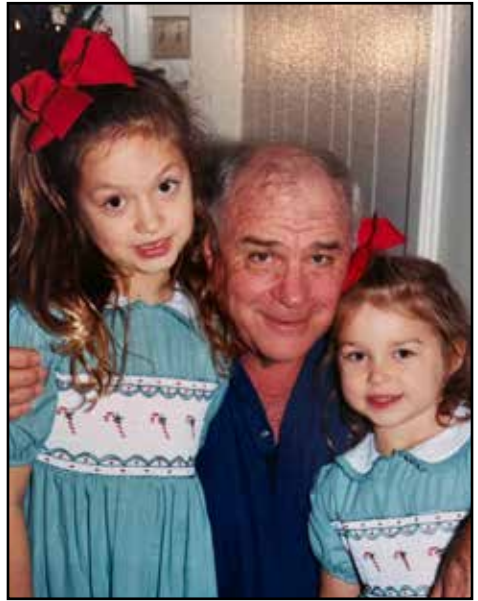
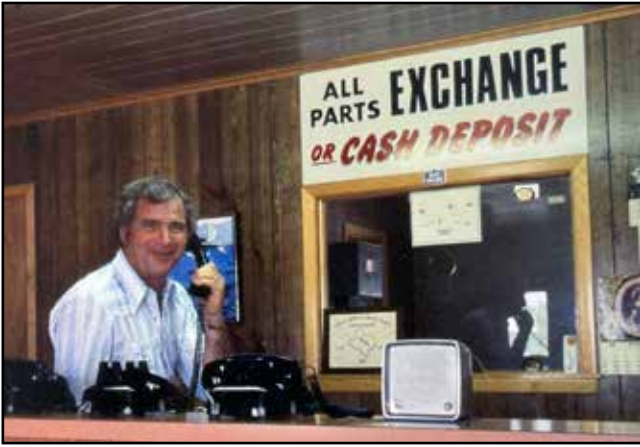
found on the golf course at Silsbee Country Club, enjoying the game and the camaraderie.

He never met a stranger and made friends wherever he went. His quick wit and easy smile left a lasting impression on everyone who knew him.

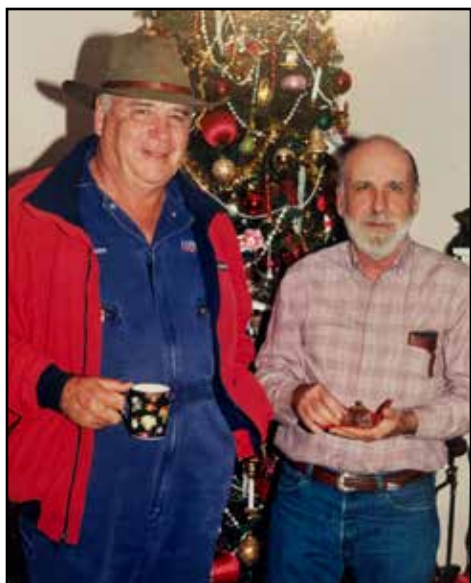
