Dolores Mae Dahl Anderson, 95, of Kountze, went to be with the Lord on Saturday, May 3, 2025. She was born May 30, 1929 in Parsons, Kansas, to Verdie Dahl and Theodore Reuben Dahl, Sr.

Dolores and the Dahl family moved to Texas when she was thirteen. They settled in the Little Rock community where the Little Rock Assembly of God Church became an important part of their lives. Dolores loved to sing and often sang solos in church. Later she sang with her dad, who was the song leader, and other family members. Some of their favorite songs were several

that her dad had written. Dolores was a longtime member of the church and was very active in church activities. She was known for her great desserts at church socials and grilled cheese sandwiches after Sunday night services.

Dolores met “the love of her life” in Texas, Manuel Anderson. They married in 1946 after Manuel had returned from serving on a destroyer in World War II. They remained married until his passing in January of 2013.
