Geraldine “Frazier” Cloy, 91, of Warren, died peacefully at home surrounded by her loved ones, Tuesday, August 26, 2025. She was born on January 24, 1934, in Red Oak, Iowa, to Veronica Gladys Bashaw Hoffman and Virgil David Hoffman.

From the time she got married to her husband Stein on July 24th, 1955, Geri would travel with him for his job as a welder for Pipeliners Local Union 798. Throughout the years they were in just about every state in the U.S.

She loved her grandchildren and great-grandchildren with all of her heart and was the happiest when she got to see them. Through one of her grandsons, Zach Lundy, she got the nickname “Frazier” because one day as a young boy he just started calling her that. It stuck with her until the day she died with both children and adults calling her that.

“Frazier” had a fondness for flowers and plants, enough so she ended up buying Flowers by Sandra in Beaumont. She owned it for a number of years and was extremely proud of its success.

“Frazier” enjoyed talking to people when they came to visit. She was always interested in finding out what was going on in the community and how everyone was doing. She was also excited to read the newspaper every day. It might take her a whole day to read it, but she could tell you pretty much word for word what was in it.

One of “Frazier’s” favorite things to do was watch sports especially the WNBA and women’s college softball. She would sit in her recliner and tell the coaches or players through the TV what they should be doing or what the heck they were thinking on each play. In the last few months before her passing she would ask each day if there was a game on to watch.

“Frazier” was a huge fan of sweets although she would tell you that she wasn’t much of a sweet’s person. Her favorites were cherry pie, ice cream cones, and peanut M&Ms. She once told us M&Ms were good for you because they had peanuts in them.

Survivors include her children, Bonnie Wilson and her husband, Shannon, of Warren; Riley Cloy of Warren; Terry Cloy of Beaumont; and Lou Ann Cloy; grandsons, T. J. shadow of death, I will fear no evil;*


for Thou art with me;
