**Dr. Robert “Bob” Wilson**, 86, of Beaumont, lost his battle with cancer on Wednesday, September 10, 2025. He passed peacefully at Harbor Hospice in Beaumont, surrounded by the love of family and friends.

He was born in Ravenna, Ohio on May 6, 1939, to Ruby Guest and Ward Wilson. He grew up in Pulaski, Virginia, and after high school, attended Hiram College on a basketball scholarship. He was called to service in the US Army and Army Reserves, then returned to Ohio to work with his father-in-law enforcement.

He earned his first Doctorate in Podiatric Surgery at Case Western Reserve, then his Doctorate in Chiropractic at Western States University in Portland, Oregon. He moved to Beaumont in 1993, opening the practice that would become Wilson Chiropractic.

Dr. Bob never met a stranger. He loved to talk to people and was truly interested in their lives. He knew a little bit about a lot of things, never failing to be able to carry on a conversation about literally anything.

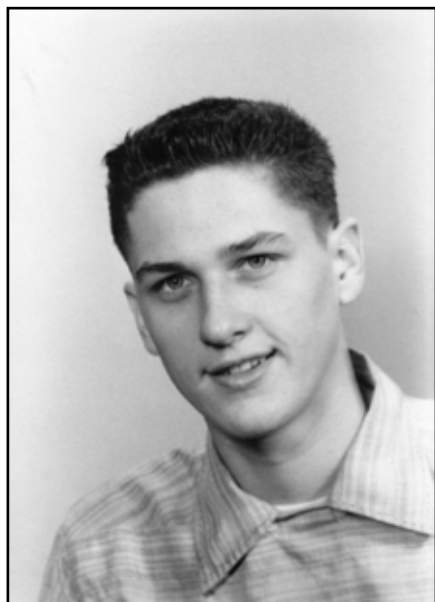

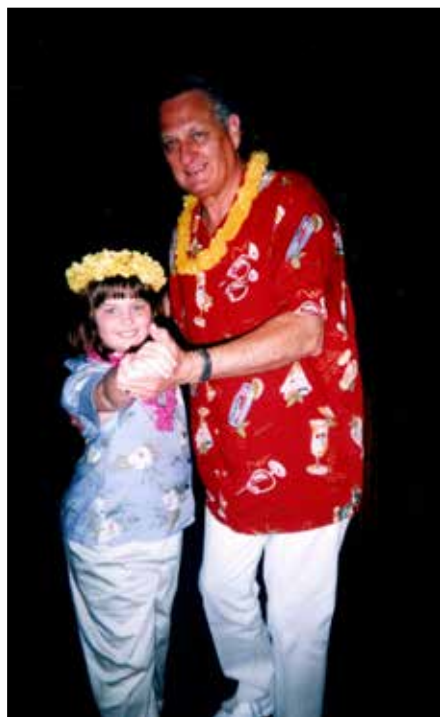
