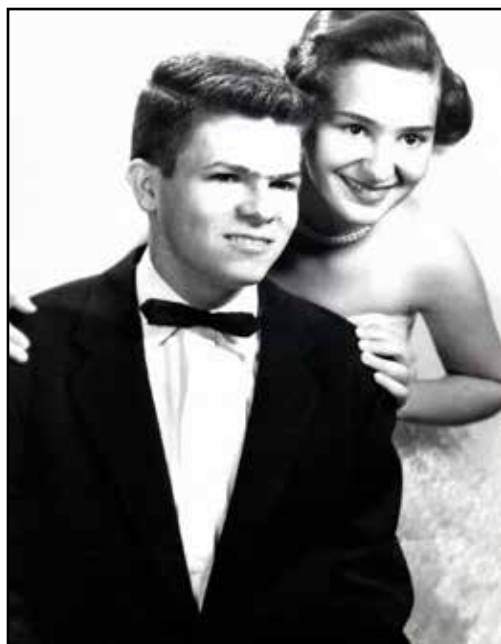

We would like to thank the staff at University Village Memory Care and Valerian Hospice Care where she was taken exceptionally good care of.

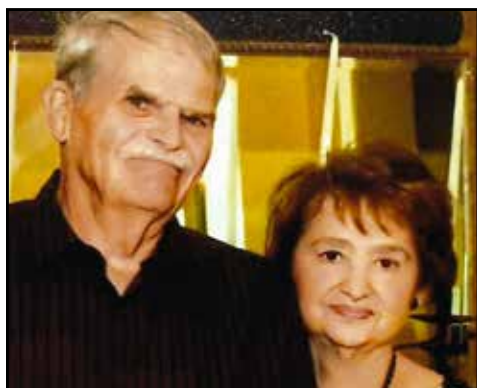
